Nick Greene said that he was preparing a letter to be sent to the Camp Commanding Officer but as the new CO was arriving in March he would wait until then.

Graeme Pattison complained about the speed of traffic on the A429 by the garage/Clanville crossroads and asked for the speed signage to be replaced with 30 mph signs and a flashing 30 sign be erected.

The Stanton St Quintin Parish Council is very concerned about the environmental impact both on neighbouring houses and on narrow twisting roads, so narrow that there is no room for a white line. The road structure is completely inadequate and cannot support HGV traffic day and night
