- **4. Public Question Time**: The Chairman reiterated the procedure for the public question time. There were no questions.
- 5. Chairman's announcements and declarations of interest: Nil
- 6. Co-option to fill vacancy: Mr Adrian Andrews of Drewmain Stud, Avils Lane, Lower Stanton St Quintin had applied for co-option. After a vote he was duly elected onto the Parish Council.

Notices for the remaining vacancy have been displayed. The closing date to request an election is 13th July.

7. Minutes: The Minutes of the Annual Meeting held on 11th May 2017 was taken as read and signed as being a true record.

- b. Neighbourhood Plan: John Seale had taken over as the Chairman of the Neighbourhood Plan committee. Letter received from Wiltshire Council Spatial Planning Officer stating that they are in the process of allocating a link officer to support the SSQ neighbourhood planning process. John reported that there is a meeting planned for 20th September and a consultation with the community.

 - Litter by the garage: Clerk had ordered three litter bins
 - Avils Lane water butt and staddlestones

The matter of the water butt has been referred to the Enforcement Officer

Owner of the Oat House to be asked to move the staddlestones back against the wall

- Damage to the Village triangle: Continue to monitor
- Overgrown Lelandii trees Newbourne Gardens: The trees have been trimmed

- <u>Double yellow lines by Murco Garage</u>: Letter received from Martin Rose. This is classed as routine maintenance but the problem is the edge of the carriageways along the length in question is badly eroded and needs repair work before any re-lining work can take place. Clerk had raised this as a priority with Adrian Hampton
- <u>Junction of Seagry Road with 429</u>: This is tied in with the Dyson planning application and the development of the distribution centre at Junction 17 as there would be an increase in the traffic. Cllr Greenman had called in the application for the distribution centre. This was an enormous building, the transport issues were huge and there were also proposals for 700 new houses to be built close by. Cllr Greenman reported that the agents had asked for another meeting in Kington Langley Village Hall on 25th July from 7-8 pm

- e. <u>Footpath 11</u> Clerk had asked for a Public Footpath sign to be put up by the Deer Farm. This has still not been erected. Mr Murton reported that Dysons had been asked to look at developing the footpath

- **Update re Buckley Barracks**: As Mr Murton was not present there was no update available.
- Village Hall: Report received. The Beavers and Cubs are using the Hall and <u>12.</u> they will be joined by the Scouts from September. Thanks were given to Andrew Jackson who had donated tons of soil for the parking area.

Letter received requesting a grant from the Parish Council towards the cost of the legal fees for the land transfer for the parking area. This could be in the region of £2000 in total. It was agreed, in principle, to make a grant up to a maximum of £2000

<u>13.</u> Ownership of the Village Green: Letter received from the solicitor. He feels that it may not be cost effective to apply for this to become a Village Green. The council would have to demonstrate that a significant number of local people have used the land for lawful sports and pastimes as of right for at least 20 years. If it is just local land that has not be used by local people for any particular purpose he did not feel that there was much prospect of success and the costs would outweigh the benefit. However, he will visit the site and report back further.

Work to trees: Quotation received from Marshall Tree Services in the sum of £250 to crown lift all the trees from the Pine tree on the left of the green to the Norway maple on the right of the green; £120 to cut back the cherry tree. It was agreed that the quotation be accepted.
