

**MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE STANTON ST QUINTIN PARISH  
COUNCIL HELD ON 11<sup>th</sup> JUNE 2019**

3. **Public Question Time:** There were eight members of the public present
4. **Chairman's announcements:** Nil
5. **Planning Application:** The following applications were considered:  
  
19/04153/FUL          Filling Station, Lower Station St Quintin  
Removal of one forecourt canopy with associated pump islands, new parking, the extension of the existing shop building and the replacement of second forecourt canopy and pump islands with a new canopy with pump islands  
  
Objections. This is over development of the site, There is no provision for HGV parking and the lorries will park on double yellow lines and block the exit. The only exit from refuelling is through the tanker bay. There are inadequate toilet facilities and disabled provision. The right of way to the neighbouring bungalow would be blocked.
6. **Parish Website:** Letter from Mr Martin Horton offering to take over the maintenance and updating of the website but also offering to draw up a new website in a more logical form. This was agreed.  
  
Mrs Gabrielle Horton declared an interest in the above item and took no part in the discussions
7. **Highway issues:**
  - **Temporary closure** of part of A429 in two phases from 7<sup>th</sup> July to enable Eurovia to carry out carriageway patching, reconstruction, surface dressing, road markings and associated works
  - **Traffic Speed Survey Result** – unnamed road east of Kington Lane  
The 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed was 32.8 mph. This is the speed at or below which 85% of the traffic is travelling and is used nationally as a criteria for Community Speed Watch interventions.  
The average speed was 25.8 mph

26.8% of recorded vehicles were exceeding the posted speed limit with a mean speed of 34.15 mph

- Area Board Issue: issue raised at CATG re speed limit on A429 junction Seagry Road, Church Lane. Update from Wiltshire Council.
